

FLEMMING BUSK and STEPHAN HERTZOG began working together decades ago — both famed, Danish designers who share an affinity for TEXTILES, INTERNATIONAL LIVING, and HUMAN BEHAVIOR.

With the opportunity to diversify our lounge portfolio, we sought their partnership



to create a SIMPLE, LIGHT, and VERSATILE LOUNGE collection that could serve as both a CENTERPIECE to any room and a SIGNATURE piece of our portfolio. With this in mind, they began where they often do — WITH PAPER — folding ORGANIC SHAPES that allowed them to design for the diversity of the HUMAN BODY, as well as AESTHETIC AND STRUCTURAL INTEGRITY across multiple bases.

The PICO collection brings a sculptural element to any lounge space from

EVERY VANTAGE POINT— evoking COMFORT, MOVEMENT, and WARMTH regardless of an individual's size, posture, or activity.



On Inspiration

"As humans, WE LIKE TO FEEL SAFE. So we do that by creating nests in our home, having convenient routines, etc. When you know where your garden fence is, you don't need to go ALL THE WAY to the corner because you already know WHERE THE FENCE IS.

By staying in the SAME GARDEN, every day you will move in a smaller and smaller circle. If you stay in the same little circle, you'll only see the SAME THINGS.

The only way to EXPLORE NEW THINGS and actually try to PUSH YOUR THINKING in a new way is to move that garden fence to WHERE YOU FEEL UNSURE — because that is where you rediscover things and get inspired in a new way."

"With PICO, we knew a few things immediately: that we had to design the chair

to make sure it was very PLEASING FROM THE BACK — not just the front or side — that we wanted to use an ORGANIC SHAPE to create a piece with a much STRONGER DESIGN PROFILE. and that it needed to fit with multiple bases. All of which could be produced without being glued. That's why we started out with paper, like we often do. Paper is two dimensional, so if you can make an

organic, sculptural shape out of a plain, two-dimensional surface, then fabric is just another surface. In sum, if you can do it WITH PAPER, you can do it

with fluent, organic, sculptural shapes that match the SCULPTURAL MOVEMENT OF THE BODY.

For us, it all comes down to HUMAN EMOTION what the product creates for the person looking at it and how people identify with THE STORY.

The worst possible thing that can happen is that when people pass the product, they just say, 'Okay.' We would rather have a negative reaction than no reaction at all."
